Set up in March 2007, the Payments Council will create a National Payments Plan to set out the strategic vision for the UK payments industry and, where appropriate, guide collaborative activity.

This conference is an important part of the public consultation on a National Payments Plan and will allow for an exchange of views by a wide range of stakeholders with an interest in UK payments.

The opportunity to create such a wide-ranging strategy is clearly an exciting one, as Chairman Brian Pomeroy commented: “I am particularly looking forward to this challenge and getting down to the task of preparing a strategy for this vital part of our national economic infrastructure.”
